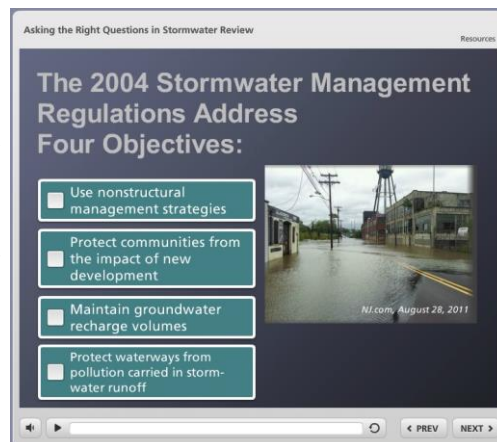

[Asking the Right Questions in Stormwater Review E-learning Tool]

The Rutgers Cooperative Extension (RCE) Water Resources Program, in partnership with the Association of New Jersey Environmental Commissions, developed a computer-based application or E-learning tool for New Jersey municipal officials. The aim of this E-learning tool is to assist municipal officials charged with reviewing stormwater plans for their New Jersey municipality. The E-learning tool is designed to help municipal officials better understand their role in reviewing stormwater management plans and provides reviewers with questions to ask during the review process to ensure compliance with stormwater regulations.

A rain barrel is placed under a gutter's downspout next to a house to collect rainwater from the roof.

The barrel holds about 50 gallons of water which can be used to water lawns, flowers, shrubs, and trees.

The fee for this workshop is \$15, which includes the barrel and all the materials.

Rainwater harvesting can help save money on water bills and reduce flooding in local rivers and streams.

Participants will be shown step by step how to build and install a rain barrel.

This workshop is part of a research project conducted by the Rutgers Cooperative Extension to determine whether rain barrels encourage adoption of other environmental best management practices by residents.
