

Home Built to EPA's WaterSense® New Home Specifications

Situation

In 2009, EPA WaterSense® announced the criteria for water-efficient new homes. New Jersey American Water introduced New Jersey Water Savers to a builder who was interested in following the guidelines to build a home to the specifications.

Water Sense® is a voluntary, national program sponsored by the EPA with a goal of preserving water for future generations by helping transform the market for water-efficient products and services. The WaterSense® label is a simple way for consumers to identify products that have been independently certified to meet EPA's criteria for efficiency and performance. For the past three years, EPA has been developing a specification for water-efficient single-family new homes to encourage the construction of houses that use at least 20 percent less water than a traditional new home.

Action

In the fall of 2009, New Jersey Water Savers partnered with Doebley and Dad Construction Company to create a WaterSense® certifiable house which adheres to the EPA New Home Specifications. The house features all WaterSense® or water efficient plumbing fixtures and appliances, a smart irrigation system and a limited lawn area (i.e., only 40% turfgrass with the remainder 60% being low water using/native plant gardens. This home is the focus of the next two water conservation videos which are being created in partnership with New Jersey American Water Company — *Saving Water is Saving Money—Outside the Home!* and *Saving Water is Saving Money—Inside the Home!*

Impact

In the next few months this home will be inspected by Masco Home Services, Inc., an independent consultant. The inspection will evaluate the home energy-efficiency and certify this home as the first EPA's WaterSense® home built to specification in the nation. This home will serve as a water-efficient model home to the building industry and to other homeowners. WaterSense® labeled products are available throughout New Jersey; products such as toilets, showerheads, bathroom faucets, high-efficiency washers for clothes and dishes are competitively priced.
